



## CLI A2 Syllabus

The A2 level English CLI course has a duration of 60 hours, consisting of two lessons per week with each lesson lasting two hours.

Students must attend 80% of the course in order to get a certificate of attendance and must pass the final test with at least 60% to gain a level certificate and be eligible for the next level at CLI.

The final test is divided into the following parts:

Listening, Reading, Grammar and Vocabulary, Writing and Speaking

### **Objectives and competences**

Upon completion of A2 and in accordance with the CEFR description of A2, students should be able to:

1. Understand sentences and frequently used expressions related to areas of most immediate relevance (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local geography, employment).
2. Communicate in simple and routine tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar and routine matters.
3. Describe in simple terms aspects of his/her background, immediate environment and matters in areas of immediate need.
