- you **don't feel like doing** at weekends
- you **spend too much time doing**
- you **are very good (or very bad) at doing**

SOMEWHERE...

- you **love going** to in the summer
- you **don't like going** to alone
- you **are thinking of going** to this weekend
- you **dream of going** to in the future
- you **hate going** to

VERBS WITH INFINITIVE:

I WOULD LIKE TO...visit the museum this weekend.

I WANT TO...start a new book tomorrow.

I HAVE TO ...speak to the director.

I AGREE TO WATCH THE FILM TOGETHER.

I WISH TO MAKE A CAKE WITH YOU

I PROMISE TO BE A GOOD STUDENT

I HOPE TO SEE YOU SOON

SHE WILL LEARN TO PLAY THE PIANO
